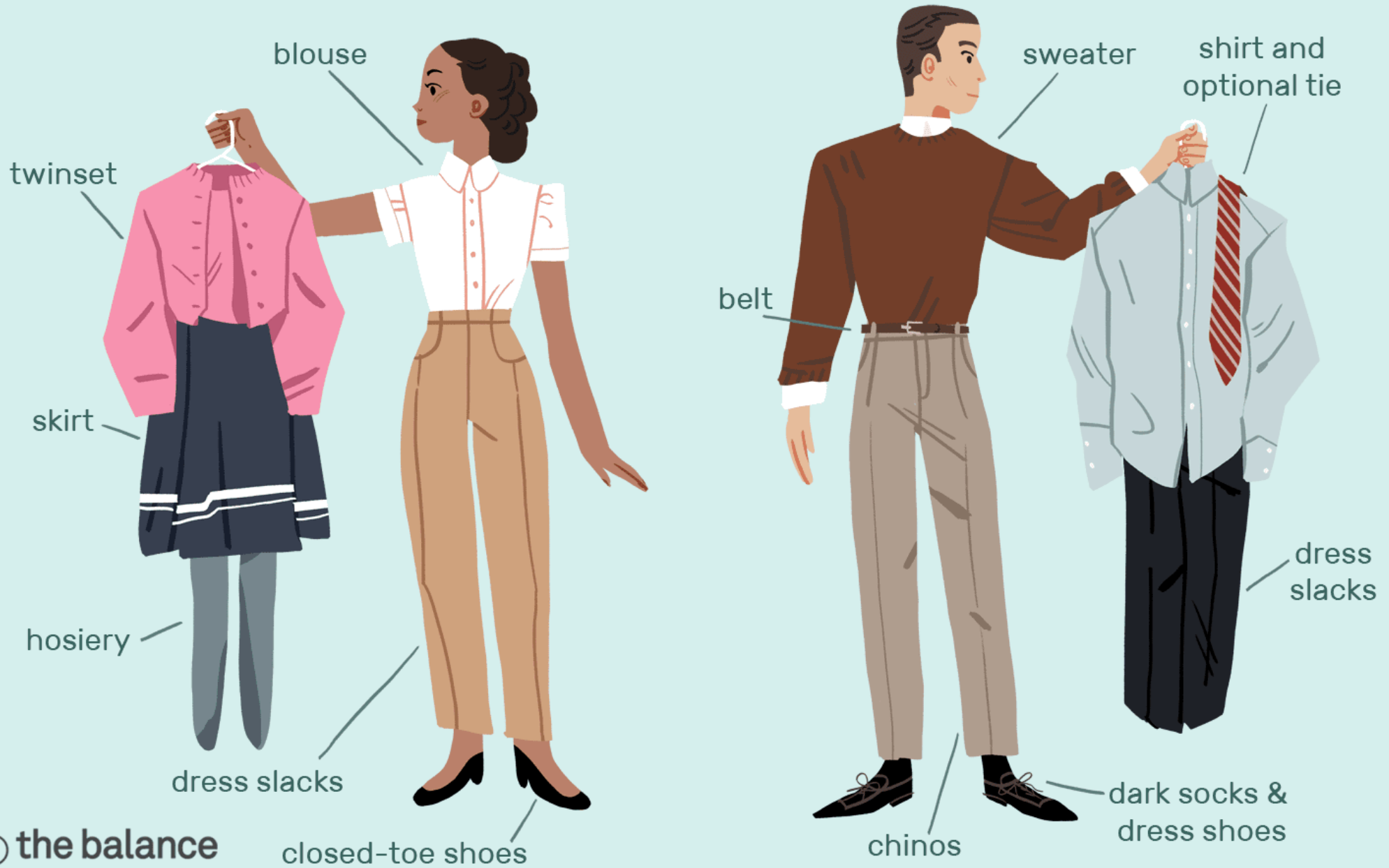

# Speaker Bios

## **Bev Kearney**

Beverly Kearney, affectionately known as “Coach Bev” is one of those rare visionary stars who believes that greatness exists within everyone. Her passion and gift for coaching, consulting, and mentoring has inspired individuals and groups in various professions to achieve their greatest successes. Recognized as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA history, Bev has been inducted to various halls of fame as a sports legend including the prestigious International Women’s Sports Hall of Fame. Her record of seven national championships is one of the highest among African-American and Female coaches in the country. She has been honored with the BET Legacy Award for



Education alongside the likes of Dr. Maya Angelou, Stevie Wonder and the Tuskegee Airmen. She was also honored with a “Lifetime Achievement Award” from Auburn University marking only the second time in History that a woman has received that award and the first African-American in history to receive the award.

Woman’s Day magazine named her as one of their “50 Women on a Mission” along with such notables as Michelle Obama, Hilary Clinton, and Angelina Jolie. The Buoniconti Foundation honored Bev as a Great Sports Legend joining other alumni legends such as Michael Jordan, Dean Smith and Muhammad Ali. Bev has also been an honored guest at The White House.

She has served as Head Coach of the University of Texas and the University of Florida, as an Assistant Coach at the University of Tennessee, the University of Toledo and Indiana State University. The men and women she coached throughout her 30-year career stand out as some of America’s best with over 15 Olympians, several World, Collegiate, and American record holders.

Her many accolades do little justice to her ability to strategically and purposefully motivate, empower and coach others to turn their goals into gold.

## **Dr. Emmett Gill**

Dr. Emmett Gill currently serves as an assistant professor at the North Carolina Central University (NCCU) Department of Social Work.

Prior to arriving at NCCU, Dr. Gill worked at the U.S. Military Academy Center for Enhanced Performance where he supervised men's and women's basketball student-athletes with academic and athletic performance enhancement as well as at Rutgers University.

Dr. Gill is also the founder of the Student-Athlete's Human Rights (SAHRP) — a 501©4 organization dedicated to social justice for student-athletes. Dr. Gill's scholarship focuses on the intersection between social work and collegiate athletics.



## **Dr. Mari Ross**

Dr. Mari Ross joined UNC Charlotte Student Affairs in August 2021. She oversees the Health & Wellbeing Unit that consists of the Center for Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS), the Student Health Center (SHC), the Center for Wellness Promotion (CWP) and University Recreation (UREC).

Ross comes to Charlotte from NCCU in Durham. As assistant vice president for student affairs, she provided executive leadership, budgetary oversight and forecast, policy development and staff management to student health, counseling services, office of health promotions, campus recreation and wellness, student accessibility services, career and professional development and women's center.

Prior to NCCU, Ross spent seven years at Tennessee State University in Nashville, Tennessee, where she served as an assistant vice president for student affairs from January 2018 to July 2019 and as counseling center director and athletics behavioral health consultant from April 2012 to January 2018.

## Jerritt Elliott



Elliott, who holds a 583-121 career record in 24 seasons as a collegiate head coach and a 533-109 mark in 21 years at Texas, has brought enthusiasm, experience and growing success to UT. That has translated to Top 10 rankings the past 16 seasons, 15 trips to the NCAA Regional finals, nine NCAA Semifinal appearances, five NCAA Championship appearances (2009, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2020) and capacity crowds at Gregory Gymnasium, the home of Texas Volleyball. Elliott's sustained success allowed him to become the program's winningest head coach, surpassing Mick Haley's 522 wins at Texas from 1980-96.

Elliott has a keen eye for young talent and he has developed a reputation as one of the nation's best recruiters. In fact, all but four of his recruiting classes have been ranked nationally, and he has a total of eight top-two recruiting classes (2003, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2015, and 2017 classes) on his Texas resume and 10 overall, including his classes at USC (2000 and 2001). Elliott's 2011 class was his first top-ranked class at Texas after previously bringing in four classes that ranked second. His philosophy of recruiting "to win national championships" - not just filling perceived needs of a team - has proven successful, as his last two classes as the head coach at USC went on to win back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003.

Elliott's peers have taken notice of his work in Austin, voting him the AVCA National Coach of the Year in 2012 while earning AVCA Region Coach of the Year honors in 2004, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2013 and 2021. He is also the eight-time Big 12 Coach of the Year honoree (2004, '07, '10, '11, '14, '18, '20 and '21).

Additionally, Elliott earned Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors in 1999 and 2000 in his two years as the Women of Troy's head coach, as well as AVCA Pacific Region Coach of the Year accolades in 2000 after leading USC to its first volleyball final four appearance in 15 seasons and first-ever share of the Pac-10 Championship.

Elliott played collegiate volleyball at Pepperdine in 1986-88 and at Hawai'i during the 1989-90 season. The Pacific Palisades, Calif., native attended Palisades High, where he was high school teammates with 1996 U.S. Olympic beach volleyball gold medalist Kent Steffes. Elliott was an All-L.A. City second-team selection as he helped Palisades to a 36-0 record in his final season.

Born April 28, 1968, Elliott earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Cal State Northridge in 1991. He has a daughter, Kahle (May 18, 1998), and two sons, Parker (July 26, 2005) and Mack (Oct. 20, 2006). Elliott and wife Andrea Nucete-Elliott were married on March 11, 2018.





## **Maren Walseth**

After competing at Penn State, in the WNBA, and internationally, Maren exchanged her sneakers for a clipboard and whistle. She was an assistant coach at The United States Naval Academy, and her alma mater, Penn State University, before leading the North Dakota State Bison as head coach. With a Broadcast Journalism degree from The Pennsylvania State University, Maren has now moved to the other side of the camera as an analyst. She is excited to bring the game into family rooms across the country and is passionate about growing the game.

For the past three seasons Maren has worked as an analyst for both the Ivy League and the Atlantic 10.

Maren is a leadership coach and program strategist, holding her ACC credential from the ICF. She enjoys staying active and attending sporting events. Maren resides in Philadelphia.



## **Dr. Tim Elmore**

Dr. Tim Elmore is the Founder and CEO of Growing Leaders, a non-profit organization created to develop emerging leaders. He and his team equip secondary school students, college students and recent graduates from thousands of campuses across the US and around the world to think and act like authentic leaders. Since founding Growing Leaders, Tim has spoken to more than 500,000 students, coaches, teachers and parents and the organization has partnered with over 8,000 diverse schools, universities and organizations including Purdue University, The University of Alabama Athletics Department, the San Francisco

Giants, the Nebraska Department of Education, the National FFA Organization, and the Houston Rockets. Tim's expertise on the emerging generation and generational diversity has led to media coverage in The Huffington Post, The Wall Street Journal, [Forbes.com](https://www.forbes.com), USA Today and The Washington Post. He has also appeared on CNN's Headline News and Fox and Friends to discuss Generation iY. Most recently, Tim was named as one of the Top 100 Leadership Speakers of 2018 in article by Kevin Kruse for Inc. magazine. Tim is the author of more than 30 books, including the best-selling Generation iY: Our Last Chance to Save Their Future, Habitudes®: Images that Form Leadership Habits and Attitudes, Life Giving Mentors, 12 Huge Mistakes Parents Can Avoid: Leading Your Kids to Succeed in Life and Marching Off the Map. His newest book Generation Z: Unfiltered releases in September 2019.



## Graham Neff

Graham Neff was named Clemson's 14th Director of Athletics on December 23, 2021. His first year in Tigertown was at full speed, as he oversaw significant facility development, including investments at football and a women's sport expansion project to house Clemson's new lacrosse and gymnastics teams. He led the bringing of Clemson's multimedia rights in-house, developed a comprehensive NIL program and launched a streaming service, Clemson+. IPTAY has seen record-breaking growth in the past year, which included the largest gift in IPTAY history.

The 39-year-old has been in senior leadership positions within Clemson Athletics since 2013, including as chief financial officer and director of capital projects prior to his most recent role as deputy director of athletics. Neff has helped oversee the build and financing of more than \$200 million in facility improvements, aided in the continued development of IPTAY, and served as a sport administrator for football and men's basketball.

Neff works consistently with key university stakeholders, including the university Executive Leadership Team, The Board of Trustees, IPTAY Board of Directors, Athletics Council, as well as several university committees and appointments.

Neff has helped develop several key areas of the department, including the financial philosophy, fundraising, student-athlete welfare, and external operations management, and in 2019 was named one of *Sports Business Daily's* Power Players and in 2021 was named to SBJ's 40 Under 40 list.

Prior to his role as Deputy AD, he joined Clemson in 2013 as Associate AD of Finance and Facilities. Before Clemson, Neff served two-plus years in several senior administrative roles at Middle Tennessee State Athletics, with emphasis in finance, facilities and external operations.

A civil engineering graduate of Georgia Tech, he served as a student manager for Coach Paul Hewitt and the men's basketball program, advancing to a Final Four in 2004. Neff worked in the Financial Advisory Services group at Deloitte and Touche from 2006 to 2008, prior to returning to a finance and ticketing role at the Georgia Tech Athletic Association. He earned an MBA from Georgia Tech in 2010.

Neff and his wife Kristin have three sons, Grady and twins Emmett and Nolan.

## Sherri Coale

Sherri Coale is a master motivator, an engaging speaker, a gifted writer and a keen observer of everyday life.
